Announcing the Final Meeting of Eco-Corridors Fund for the Caucasus Regional Consultative Forum

Tbilisi, Georgia – Eco-Corridors Fund for the Caucasus is announcing their Final meeting of the Regional Consultative Forum in Tbilisi at the Hotel Moxy on November 26, 2019 marking the final formal gathering of the programme.

Eco-Corridors Fund for the Caucasus (ECF) is proud to bring together representatives from the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), KfW German Development Bank and WWF Caucasus as well as governmental delegate from Armenia and Azerbaijan and Georgia.

The meeting will provide an **overview of the ECF's actions** that have led to nineteen conservation agreements between WWF and local communities in the three countries of the South Caucasus, securing community-based conservation on 75.000 hectares of landscapes. The results of recently completed programme evaluation will also be shared.

Presentations will be followed by a **facilitated panel discussion** involving representatives of participating local communities and independent experts. The discussion will focus on the lessons learned through the programme related to opportunities for community conservation of biodiversity and opportunities for sustainable socio-economic development of rural communities of Caucasus based on nature conservation and sustainable use of resources.

The meeting will close with statements on the **future outlook** of the ECF programme, finalizing the start-up phase of the programme, and marking the commencement of the implementation phase.

ECF is a funding instrument supporting community-based biodiversity conservation in Georgia, Armenia and Azerbaijan. Eco-corridors connect various classifications of parks, protected areas and community-managed landscapes across the three countries. ECF uses simple steps and processes to engage communities in nature conservation, leading to contractual nature conservation agreements that provide funding for ecologically sustainable land use in specific regions and selected communities. The result is an interconnected mosaic of managed and unmanaged habitats under various land categories and classifications. These community-managed landscapes protect, connect and support healthy native ecosystems while ensuring the socio-economic status of the communities is not diminish, and in many cases is improved.







The project is based on two parallel and interlinked processes: scientific identification then prioritization of critical eco-corridors and target species; and community-based approaches which develop trust, awareness, ownership and motivation for sustainable livelihood activities and long-term commitment for protection of these prioritized areas through conservation agreements implemented over a period of 10 years.

"First, the eco-corridors are important for migration of species and the connection of protected areas. Second, the social conditions of people are important.
